take it up with Him. There is another important note about this verse, "32 "But of that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but the Father alone." The main point here is that "no one knows the day or the hour" of His return. This statement clearly therefore forbids anyone setting a date for it, and we must be wary of date setters as they surely arrogantly disrespect the words of our Lord here.

Mark 13:33-37 - 33 "Take heed, keep on the alert; for you do not know when the appointed time is. 34 "It is like a man, away on a journey, who upon leaving his house and putting his slaves in charge, assigning to each one his task, also commanded the doorkeeper to stay on the alert. 35 "Therefore, be on the alert — for you do not know when the master of the house is coming, whether in the evening, at midnight, at cockcrowing, or in the morning — 36 lest he come suddenly and find you asleep. 37 "And what I say to you I say to all, 'Be on the alert!" NASB

Now Jesus speaks to apply these prophetic words to those He intends to hear. "33 "Take heed, keep on the alert; for you do not know when the appointed time is." The words "Take heed, keep on the alert" emphasize that we must respond to His warnings by paying close attention to the world around us looking for those signs He said would attend His Coming. We should consider the words of prophecy concerning Jesus Second Coming very important indeed. I have noticed a tendency among contemporary Christians the thought that prophetic events are very confusing and complex and therefore not worth the effort to understand. But nothing could be further from the truth. Many spends hours upon hours of screen time on social media, but very little time studying the Bible, and especially studying prophecy. Let us hear the exhortation of our Lord and "Take heed, keep on the alert." Jesus clearly taught in this Olivet Discourse that His Second Coming would be a deliverance for His disciples, and that when they see these events happening, that they should expect this deliverance of the Second Coming.

Luke 21:28 - 28 "But when these things begin to take place, straighten up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is drawing near." NASB

So in regard to that serious worldwide deception and persecution of those days just prior to my Coming, don't be surprised or overtaken in deception when tested, "13:23 "But take heed; behold, I have told you everything in advance." Moreover, we must be carefully paying attention because we "do not know when the appointed time is." We must be looking eagerly and expectantly for the Lord's return, and especially as He taught us, the signs that will precede His

return. He then explains, how we should take heed, "34" It is like a man, away on a journey, who upon leaving his house and putting his slaves in charge, assigning to each one his task, also commanded the doorkeeper to stay on the alert. Look, this applies to you and me, and to "take heed" to Jesus words is like Him giving us tasks to fulfill in His Kingdom work. Christian what are you doing this week to serve the Lord with the gifts and talents He has given to you? How are you fulfilling your role serving His people in the Church with your gifts (Rom 12:3-8, 1 Cor 12:4-7)? Are you a **disciple-making disciple** like He taught all His disciples to be, and using what gifts and talents you have to see His Kingdom work come to fruition? Christian, what task has our Lord assigned to you, "assigning to each one his task" that you are regularly giving yourself to accomplish while He is away on His long journey? Let us solemnly consider His words and how we apply them to ourselves and let us not be lulled to sleep and complacency by this godless culture that we live in. Rather let us, "35 Therefore, be on the alert for you do not know when the master of the house is coming, whether in the evening, at midnight, at cockcrowing, or in the morning — 36 lest he come suddenly and find you asleep. 37 "And what I say to you I say to all, 'Be on the alert!" Well these are solemn words indeed! But let us see them as the great opportunity to identify and get busy with the work of the Lord that He has called us to. When we become disciples of Jesus, we sign up for service and we sign up for **suffering**. No Christian is **exempt** from them and this an emphasis in much of Jesus teaching. And the work of the Kingdom is a spiritual work that benefits and moves forward the work of the Gospel in seeing people come to faith, and it benefits and moves forward the work of the Church in discipling and mentoring, service to others, and the worship of God. We all have a role to play in this and this is how Jesus tells us to "Take heed, keep on the alert." Dear Christian, the Lord calls you to serious service, and this is much clearer where Jesus expands on these words in The Parable of the Talents in Matthew 25:14-30. There Jesus gives His disciples warning that they are to take their God given time, talent, and treasure and put it to work for His Kingdom and to accomplish the Master's tasks. Let us stop and take heed and consider how we are **investing** our precious time in Christs work? How are we spending our money to serve the Lord? And what specific talents do you have that you offer to the Lord regularly in selfdenying toil and effort for the selfless benefit of others who are coming to faith, or are already safely in the church? I hope and pray dear Christian that you have good answers for these questions. May God help us to see clearly the things He has called us to and may we hear those blessed words on the great Day of Christ....
